The Impact Design team is very excited to work with the Sudden Valley Community Association (SVCA) on the Sudden Valley Trail Master Plan project. As a local team invested in our community, we strive to provide they very best and most efficient engineering, planning and environmental services for our clients.

SVCA is requesting a scope and fee estimate for this project. We appreciate the quick return on selection of our firm and will do our best to expedite answers to any scope, fee, and contracting questions for this work. We are ready to start on this project right away.

Scope

Creating the Trail System Master Plan will require cooperative participation from the SVCA, the community, and SVCA former consultants. This cooperation will help assure the complete, timely, effective, and efficient deliverables. The below deliverable schedule is intended to provide the most efficient pathway to producing the Trail System Master Plan:

- Trail System Concept Plan
- Project Preliminary Cost Estimate and Budgeting
- Community Outreach
- Trail System Master Plan

We also plan to include all pertinent and available previous data collected by SVCA in our final product. This consolidation will build on the information that the SVCA has already acquired and provide a package that can be easily referenced. Our goal is to provide an easy-to-use reference document that may be used over the next 10-years by SVCA for decision making guidance on budgetary expenditures and improvements.

Deliverable Products

1. Trail System Concept Plan

We assume that Impact Design will have prepared or be provided an updated working GIS drawing of the Sudden Valley Basemap depicting all areas currently under the control of SVCA. This map will serve as the foundation document for the planned trail system concept.

A trail system will be designed to include pedestrian and multimodal options connecting Gates and also other important community facilities. Lighting designs will also be considered. In appropriate locations, sidewalks and other pedestrian amenities will be suggested. The existing inventory of the trail system will be utilized in this map and project descriptions will be included.

With any trail proposal, our experience has shown that community outreach is an essential part of this exercise. Once a general concept of trail connection opportunities is determined, we will support the SVCA in a robust program of public outreach. Our design team will provide background materials and support and are available to attend meetings to answer questions and provide presentation. The public outreach can take many forms, including:

- Public Meetings
- Public Online or Mailing Surveys
- Direct Mailings
- Website Coordination

*Direct mailing material costs may be managed by our team but are not included in the fee schedule. Update of the SVCA website and online surveys will be the responsibility of SVCA, with content provided by the Impact Design team. SVCA is expected to provide meeting space or digital platform for any public meeting.

2. Project Preliminary Cost Estimate and Budgeting

After input from SVCA, the Impact Design team will provide preliminary cost estimates for trail improvements. Trail improvement cost estimates will not be site specific, but will include general horizontal alignments and crossections. Lighting concepts can also be considered if requested.

Cost estimates will be performed on a per lineal foot basis and not include detailed grading or environmental impacts or mitigation costs. However, these planning level cost estimates will be critical to budgeting the construction of the proposed trail system.

3. Community Outreach and Coordination

Community involvement is critical for the trail system development. It would be beneficial to communicate with public interests including any trail volunteer groups to identify the amenities requested. We will meld public comment with multi-modal trail connection planning design. We expect to prepare presentations for two public meetings to discuss the initial trail concept with the homeowners. These public meeting presentations will include the following deliverables:

- Meeting Agenda
- Meeting Presentation Materials:
 - Preliminary Proposed Trail Map
 - Concept Trail Crossections
 - Multi-Modal Improvement Concepts

4. Trail Master Plan

The previous trail system maps, descriptions and cost estimate budgeting figures will be included in a revised narrative based on the results from public outreach. This will include the following items:

- Improvement Type and Location
- Improvement Length
- Project Descriptions
- Anticipated Permitting Required

Items To Be Provided by SVCA:

Impact's simple goal is to *provide the best product at the lowest practicable cost*. This means that our team <u>must</u> collect and use <u>all existing data</u> as effectively as possible. With this in mind, we expect that our team will have ready access to all the data that SVCA can supply. In general, SVCA already has ownership of all work products (in digital format including AutoCAD drawing, GIS file, survey files and spreadsheets). SVCA can help speed our work and save community funds by providing:

- o Existing data and digital drawing Information from Previous Consultants
- Yearly Capital Improvement Budget
- o Feedback and acceptance of each project milestone deliverable
- Location space for community meetings

Exclusions

Construction or permit level plans and specification documents, permits, boundary survey work, geotechnical work, traffic studies, architectural design, landscape design, material costs for mailings, costs associated with updating the SVCA website or other online materials, title reports, construction support, as-builts and dry utility design are not included in this scope.

Fee

This project will be performed on a Time and Materials basis with a Not to Exceed (NTE) Contract Amount of \$71,450 based on the attached cost spreadsheet. Additional work above this NTE amount will be negotiated by a change order to the original contract.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit a proposal to provide engineering and permitting assistance for the 2024 Notice of Activity Culvert Replacement and Deer Run Lane Overlay project. We understand that the Sudden Valley Community Association is working to improve its roadway and drainage systems throughout the entire community.

We propose to conduct the engineering for this project on a <u>Not To Exceed</u> basis in accordance with the rate sheets attached and our budget of \$23,000.

Scope of Work:

Impact Design will prepare construction and permit-approved documents for approximately 48 culvert replacements, and the Deer Run Lane Road repair/overlay in the Sudden Valley Community Association. The locations will be measured and accounted for in ready-to-bid construction documents and for permits with Whatcom County Planning and Development Services as a Notice of Activity in accordance with the SVCA Programmatic Permit.

Culvert Replacements Evaluation and Notice of Activity (\$15,000 Total)

- Scope: Prepare engineering bid documents to depict the location, size, and material of the culvert replacement for the purpose of a Notice of Activity submittal and construction plans. A base map will be prepared using existing GIS information and no field survey will be performed for this task. A professional engineer licensed in the State of Washington will provide civil engineering plans for the proposed improvements that will be accepted by Whatcom County Planning and Development. Impact Design will also provide the project management for this work. This will include the below civil engineering documents:
 - Permitting & Construction Documents
 - Cover Sheet
 - Culvert Replacement Locations & Descriptions
 - Temporary Erosion and Sedimentation Control Plan

Deer Run Lane Design Repair Evaluation and Notice of Activity (\$8,000 Total)

- Scope: Complete a site visit to determine drainage issues and any roadway failures. Prepare engineering bid documents to depict the size and scale of the overlay and other drainage improvements, for the purpose of a Notice of Activity submittal and construction plans. A base map will be prepared using a calculated survey boundary to verify lengths and dimensions of the proposed project. No field survey will be performed for this task. A professional engineer licensed in the State of Washington will provide civil engineering plans for the proposed improvements that will be accepted by Whatcom County Planning and Development. Impact Design will also provide the project management for this work. This will include the below civil engineering documents:
 - Permitting & Construction Documents
 - Cover Sheet & Existing Conditions Map
 - Culvert Replacement Locations & Descriptions
 - Temporary Erosion and Sedimentation Control Plan
 - Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan
 - Details

Excluded Scope: Site specific culvert designs, geotechnical work, SEPA process, traffic studies, architectural design, structural engineering, landscape design, title reports, construction inspection, as-builts and dry utilities coordination are not included in this scope.

SVCA 10-Year Capital Plan, 2023 Culvert Projects & 2024 Culvert/Road Projects.

The purpose of this Technical Memorandum is to give recommendations for the 2023 and 2024 infrastructure improvement projects and to give a preliminary cost estimate as a means to review the planned yearly budget amounts. Based on Impact Designs completed field investigation of the Sudden Valley Community Association roadway and drainage infrastructure for the 10-year Capital Improvements project, we found a total of 58 drainage culverts that appear to be in critical condition.

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The following 10 culverts were found to be in the greatest critical condition and are recommended to be replaced this year. We estimate each project will have a cost of approximately \$10,000 - \$15,000 each depending on material/diameter/length. This gives a project budget range of \$100,000 - \$150,000 total.

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Impact Design recommends that in addition to drainage improvement projects, at least one major asphalt overlay road project should be considered yearly. For the 2024 construction season Impact Design recommends Deer Run Lane should be overlayed. We estimate overlay projects will cost \$4.00 - \$5.00 per square foot. This gives the overlay of Deer Run Lane a project budget range of \$180,000 - \$225,000.

Overall Conclusions

Should all culvert and roadway projects we have recommended for the 2024 construction season be completed, we estimate the total costs to be in the \$670,000 - \$960,000 range. The cost estimate per culvert replacement, and cost per square foot of asphalt overlay is based on local historical data alone, and no engineered design has been done. Prior to construction, an engineering analysis and civil/stormwater engineering drawings should be completed. Based on this analysis a yearly budget of \$900,000 to \$1,000,000 appears to be adequate to catch up with and maintain SVCA's infrastructure for the next 3-5 years.

Based on our current progress we expect to have the first draft of the SVCA 10-Year Capital Improvements Plan by the end of August.

Subject: Capital Request – 2023 Culvert Replacements

Purpose

To request funding approval for design, permitting, and construction for the replacement of culverts.

Background

Impact Design prepared a memo dated 6-30-23, and an update dated 8-7-23, identifying 10 culverts for replacement this year. This project proposes to complete the replacement of these 10 culverts that are all at the end of their life cycle.

Analysis

SVCA has a large network of roads and culverts. Numerous culverts have been identified as needing replacement based on the review completed by Impact Design. Impact Design has prepared a list of 10 proposed culverts for replacement this year. Attached is a summary from PNW Services, Inc. dated 8-8-23 that identifies the proposed project in detail.

As identified in PNW's summary, not all 10 culverts will be able to be replaced this year with the available Road funds. It is recommended that the project move forward with the maximum amount of Road funds available, and then culverts will be replaced by order of priority. The project will be managed to work within the limit of funds available to replace culverts, and complete asphalt patching at each location.

Proposal

Authorize design, permitting, and construction to replace up to 10 culverts per PNW Services, Inc. attached Proposal dated 8-8-23.

Request 1

Request \$109,712.47 from Roads to replace up to 10 culverts in 2023.

Request 2

Request contract change order approval to Stremler Gravel and WRS with the maximum combined amount staying within the identified project funds.

Move that the Board of Directors approve the allocation of \$109,712.47 from Roads for the 2023 Culvert Replacement Project.

2023 Culvert Replacements

PNW is providing this overall project scope letter to replace 10 culverts in 2023 identified in Impact Design's memo. Overall scope of work assumes:

- Impact Design prepared a memo dated 6-30-23 (see attached) identifying 10 culverts proposed for replacement in 2023, and additional culvert replacements along with road improvements proposed for 2024. This memo identified a general range of \$10,000 to \$15,000 per culvert on average for replacement. The price per culvert substantially varies based on length, depth, size of culvert, and other factors such as clearing required/utility conflicts/etc. At 10 culverts using the high end of this estimate the total is \$150,000.
- Impact Design prepared an updated memo dated 8-7-23 (see attached) updating the list of 10 culverts proposed for 2023. This updated list has been used to prepare the proposed budget.
- This project is intended to use funds previously dedicated to other road projects in 2023 that have become available. This includes:
 - o Capital Code 9923.42 2023 Street Pavement Markings
 - At the time of contract award \$7,518.43 was returned to the Roads fund.
 - The project is complete and didn't use the 10% contingency allocated. This frees up \$3,574.66 that can be returned to the Roads fund.
 - o Capital Code 9923.43 2023 Street Asphalt Repairs
 - At the time of contract award \$101,419.71 was returned to the Roads fund.
 - The project is complete, and didn't use all of the 25% contingency allowed. An additional \$33,818.67 can be returned to the Roads fund.
 - Ocombined, these 2 capital codes total \$146,331.47 in available Roads funds this year from projects previously allocated.
 - Of this total, \$36,619.00 has been separately requested to fund the design and permitting for the 2024 Road & Drainage Project.
 - o This leaves a balance of \$109,712.47 available for replacement of culverts identified in 2023.
- The project design is currently complete with Impact Design preparing the updated memo. Impact is in the process of preparing an NOA (Notice of Activity) permit application to Whatcom County. The allocation below covers these 2 fees.
- With the Asphalt Repairs and Pavement Markings projects just finishing to identify how much funds are available, this project is proposed to move forward as a change order to Stremler's contract on a Time and Materials basis. This process will save the time and



expense of preparing a bid package, going to bid, and then contract award given the time of year and limited weather left in summer to complete. This format has worked extremely well so far this year with the culvert cleaning and drainage improvements completed to date. The benefit to this is working around the utilities that vary substantially between each location. Stremler works diligently to finish as proven to date, and SVCA isn't paying additional money to cover unknowns or standby time for utility conflicts. Also, with all the work completed to date this year by Stremler they are familiar with each location proposed. Attached is a summary total of anticipated expense to complete all 10 locations.

- A change order is also proposed to WRS's contract to patch the culverts replaced this year. This would be a unit price change order with anticipated rates shown in the attached budget.

The following is a summary of anticipated costs to complete all 10 culvert repairs in 2023.

Total Estimate – Design, Permitting, and Construction	\$158,097.21

With the available funds at \$109,712.47 some of the culverts proposed for 2023 will not be able to be completed based on the above budget. PNW recommends the Board approve the available funds for this project to move forward, and then culvert locations will be completed by order of priority with the funds available. Culvert locations not completed this year would be added to the 2024 Road & Drainage Project.
